
An Inter House ‘Patriotic Song singing competition’ was conducted in the school.

Recently our Hon. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has banned 1000 and 500 notes in order to stop black money. In my opinion this decision has some good points and bad points as well.

According to me, the good points are:

- 1. The government had made the rule that you can pay 500 and 1000 notes in airports, hospitals and railway stations. This means that people can use the old 500 and 1000 notes already present with them.*
- 2. This will block all the Black Money people have with them as they cannot use the old 500 and 1000 notes lying with them.*
- 3. Whatever 500 and 1000 notes are getting exchanged, will be available to Indian Government to use for citizen projects.*

However this sudden decision also has created some problems:

- 1. People are finding it difficult to purchase items which we use daily as there is no change available with the shopkeepers.*
- 2. The people have to stand in line for hours and hours wasting time, just to get the new notes and only of Rs. 2000 denominations. This means people have no change money with them.*
- 3. People have started using Credit Cards for buying things but with this there is a tremendous load on the Credit Card Bank Servers making them slow to operate. People have to retry around 10 or 15 times to complete the transaction. This is leading to a lot of wastage of time.*
- 4. The ATM machines have to be readjusted to give out only 20, 50, 100 denominations which is taking a lot of time and hence most of the ATM's are down. People cannot withdraw their own money.*
- 5. It was said that the new denominations will have tracking options such as GPS which was told over the news. However this is not the case and hence there is a question as how will new denominations help track black money transactions.*

Therefore, I feel that currently it is creating more problems than solving them.

VEDIC MATHEMATICS - MATH



Late Shankaracharya of Govardhan is regarded as Modern Architect of Vedic Mathematics. Based on sixteen simple sutras (formulas), Vedic Math is considered as the fastest and shortest means to solve various mathematical problems. Vedic Math is an ancient Indian technique of arithmetic calculations, where steps involved in calculations are reduced, there by improving the speed of calculations by at least five times. It involves lot of mental calculations which improves concentration. Elimination of steps improves accuracy. OUR YOUNG SCIENTISTS

We all have seen many cartoons or fictional characters travel from one place to other in an instant, or in a fraction of a second. This phenomenon is known as Teleportation. The idea of teleportation was first thought by the writers of comic books or cartoon show makers which became an idea worth discussing for the scientists.

American writer, Charles Ford, is credited for coining the term Teleportation in 1931. There is a phenomenon known as Quantum Entanglement which says about two particles being entangled but not physically. Whenever you change the physical characteristics of particle A, they are changed automatically for particle B as well, because they are entangled or connected. This is the basic principle of teleportation.

The objects which are used for Teleportation are seen as a form of data, when they try to teleport an object from particle A to particle B, the data of the object is sent to particle B by particle A, and for a fraction of a microsecond the object is seen at both particle A and particle B. After the data is successfully sent, particle A deletes the data and we say that the Teleportation process is completed as the object has successfully changed place.

Researchers in Germany claimed to have figure out how to teleport information from one place to other place using lasers. According to recent studies physicist have found that the Teleportation is not possible for humans apply on themselves.

Recently Quantum Computers have been invented and it has given the researchers hope that Teleportation is not too far away from their reach as well.

BUCKMINSTERFULLERENE - A CARBON MOLECULE

What does such a big word 'Buckminsterfullerene' mean? It is the third allotrope of carbon which can also be called as 'Fullerene'. It was first identified by C-60 which has carbon atoms arranged in the shape of football.

It was designed by US architect Buckminster Fuller, so named as Buckminsterfullerene or Fullerene and was discovered by Sir Harry Kroto from the University of Sussex and Richard Smalley & Bob Curl from Rice University in 1985 during a joint research project.

Unlike other two allotropes, Buckminsterfullerene is not hard as the diamond and not even soft as Graphite. This molecule is extremely stable and have the ability to withstand at high temperature & pressure. Diamond & Graphite are giant molecules which consists of an unending network of carbon atoms where as fullerene is very small molecule made up of only 60 carbon atoms. As fullerene is made up of only 60 carbon atoms in football shape, the atoms are powerfully banded to one another which makes it a superconductor.
