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First aid workshop for teachers

The door to safety swings on the hinges of common sense.

Teaching first aid to teachers provides them with essential skills that can be life saving. Taking into consideration the importance of medical emergency preparedness, City International School, Satara road, organised a first aid training workshop for teachers on July 20. Teachers from the pre-primary, primary and secondary sections along with the administrative staff attended the workshop.

During this workshop, Pawan Malode explained the dos and don'ts in situations like injuries, accidents, snake bite, fire accident and electric shock. He shed light on a new law passed by the government, known as the 'Good Samaritan Law'.

The law intended to reduce the bystander's hesita-

He also explained what type of first aid should be administered in situations like heart attack, cardiac arrest, epilepsy, snake bite, dog bite etc. With the help of demonstration, he explained how to handle fractures, ar-

rest bleeding, different bandaging techniques, lifting techniques and also administer cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

He also insighted the teachers on how to prevent fire hazards and in case of fire emergency, how to ensure the safety of all personnel. He also gave the demonstra-
